BAA entered a Gents Barebow team and a mixed team into this year's National County Teams Championships. Report by Imran-

At this years championships the county entered a complete Gents Barebow team consisting of Kalhan (South Bucks), Imran (Whiteleaf) and Tan (Shenley) as well as a mixed team with Rukhsana (Whiteleaf) representing the county.







Saturday saw some rather pleasant weather, which for anyone who has been to Lilleshall is a rare occurrence. The morning saw the WA720 round being shot as the qualification for the

afternoon's head to heads. The men's team ended the morning in 9th position out of a total of 13 counties.

The afternoon saw the head to heads where we faced Gloucestershire, they took the first 2 sets. We fought back to win the third set but unfortunately lost the fourth set so ended up 9th overall.

Sunday saw the return of the usual weather conditions at Lilleshall, with gusting wind, rain and occasional sunshine. Archers shot another WA720 for qualifications. Our Tier 1 team placed 7th with our Tier 2 team placing 13th on account of only one archer shooting. The head to heads were cut short as the wind had picked up substantially so the organisers took the call to cancel the remaining event.

Not having a complete ladies team meant that for the overall event Bucks Barebow team ended up in 12th.



Overall, the team members enjoyed the event and are proud to have represented Buckinghamshire. It was a great opportunity to meet archers from other counties and compete at a national level with some of the country's best archers. We hope that others put their names forward for next years event, there were many archers from other counties for whom this was the first time they were competing away from their county. - Imran.
